Summer school

"Economic, social and cultural rights of migrant children in the European Union" Jean Monnet Module MARS a.a. 2021/2022

Art. 1 General information

The Dirpolis Institute of the Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies of Pisa is pleased to announce the summer school "Economic, social and cultural rights of migrant children in the European Union", pursuant to art. 7 of the Charter.

The Course is part of the three-year Jean Monnet Module MARS "Migration, Asylum and Rights of Minors" and it will be run from the **22**nd **the 30**th **June 2022**, for a total of 40 hours, pursuant to the course structure provided in art. 5.

The Course will take place on-line through the Cisco Webex platform provided by the Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies. Classes will be held live and students will be required to log in and participate to the class in order to meet the participation requirements pursuant to art. 10.

Enrolment must be limited to a maximum of 30 participants.

The official language of the Course is English.

Art. 2 - ECTS

The acknowledgement of 2 European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS) is foreseen for students attending 70% of the whole Course and pass the final learning assessment test pursuant to art. 5. Training credits are envisaged for lawyers on the basis of specific agreements entered into with the respective professional Bodies.

Art. 3 Learning Objectives

The Course aims to provide a comprehensive training on economic, social and cultural rights of migrant children, with particular reference to international covenants, regional treaties and EU law. A particular attention will be devoted to the case law of the European Court of Human Rights and the European Union Court of Justice and to the current challenges for the protection of migrant children's rights, such as the impact of Covid-19, climate change, human trafficking and smuggling.

Participants will acquire a broad knowledge of the rights of migrant children both for scientific research purposes (for student, Ph.D. students, etc.) and in relation to the acquisition and updating of their

professional skills (for professionals, such as: lawyers, practitioners; reception center workers, guardians, etc.).

In particular, the Course has the following educational objectives:

- offering an advanced insight on the international and EU law on immigration and asylum, with a particular reference to international covenants and regional treaties (such as the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, the UN Refugee Convention, the European Convention on Human Rights);
- providing practical and immediately applicable knowledge, using a multidisciplinary perspective, on the economic, social, cultural of migrant children, offering also an overview of the relevant case law through case study analysis;
- offering an overview of challenges that EU and Member States are facing in protecting children's rights, such as the impact of Covid-19, climate change and environmental rights, human trafficking and smuggling, socio-economic discrimination, transition to the adulthood for unaccompanied minors, etc.

The most relevant issues arising from the EU Pact on Migration and Asylum, from the EU Strategy on the Rights of the Child (2021-2024), from the EU Child Guarantee and from the CoE Strategy for the Rights of the Child (2022-2027) will be discussed during the lectures, providing participants with all the relevant teaching materials (regulations, case-law, reports, etc.). The training material will be available on a devoted training platform and on the MARS website (www.mars.santannapisa.it). Participants will have access to on-line resources ahead of the sessions, so as to favour their active participation during classes and improve the learning experience.

Art. 4 Recipients

The Course is intended for the following main recipients: professionals (such as: public officers, lawyers, consultants, legal operators, social workers, guardians) and academics, Ph.D. students and students (who have a general knowledge of the matter and intending to upgrade their knowledge and competences).

Art. 5 Course Structure

The Course is structured into **lectures** and **case-studies sessions**; the interdisciplinary approach is one of the main features of the course. Case studies sessions and Q&A sessions are planned in order to stimulate the exchanges between trainers and trainees, promoting the creation of a **network** among all the participants.

The Course will be held online from 22nd to 30th June 2022 (the first session from 22nd to 24th June and the second session from 27th to 30th June), for a total amount of 40 hours of training. Participants will be supported in using the online training platform chosen for the course and provided by the Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna. Each day is composed of 6 hours of lessons (time 9:00-13:00 and 14:00-16:00), except for the last day that is composed by 4 hours of lessons (9:00-13:00). Case studies sessions and Q&A sessions are planned in order to stimulate the exchanges between trainers and trainees, promoting the creation of a **network** among all the participants.

A detailed **program** is available on the website of the Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies (<u>www.santannapisa.it</u>, section "Alta Formazione/Advance Education") and on the MARS website (<u>https://www.mars.santannapisa.it</u>, section "training courses").

The **final learning assessment test** will consist in a contribution to the final lecture on "Economic, social and cultural rights of migrant children in the European Union: lecture with participants", to be held in class on the 30th June 2021, through a presentation about one of the topics analysed during the Course, in accordance with the procedures that will be indicated.

Participants will be invited to attend the final Conference of the Jean Monnet Module MARS, that will be held in presence in Pisa in July 2022.

Art. 6 Admission requirements

An admission application may be submitted by persons who have a **general knowledge of the matter** and who would like to update their competences. Since the lectures will be held in English, participants are asked to be **fluent in English** in order to actively participate to the lectures.

Art. 7. Admission Application

The enrolment application is to be received by the **13**th **June 2022** and is to be submitted exclusively on-line by registering at the following website: www.santannapisa.it, section "Advance Education"

The following documentation is to be attached to the enrolment application, under penalty of exclusion:

- curriculum vitae;
- other documents of interest (for example: self-declaration or certificates related to the status of international protection holders, in order to benefit from the exemption pursuant in art. 8);
- a currently valid identity document.

A specific selection is not envisaged. If the number of applications received exceeds the number of places available, the Scientific Coordinator reserves the right to select the participants on the basis of their curriculum vitae.

The online application requires a registration and login procedure (including the creation of a "User ID" and of a "Password"). The required documentation shall be attached before completing the on-line application form. Applications received after the deadline or submitted in a form other than the one indicated in this article as well as incomplete applications, for whatever reason, will not be considered.

The list of successful candidates admitted to the Course will be made known exclusively on the website of the Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies. Each candidate shall be responsible for verifying his/her admission to the Course.

Applications received after the deadline or submitted in a form other than the form indicated in this article, for whatever reason, will not be considered.

Falsification of documents and fraudulent statements are punished in accordance with the Italian Criminal Code and the special applicable laws, Art. 75 and Art. 76 of Presidential Decree (D.P.R.) No. 445/2000.

The Institution may monitor the truthfulness of the statements provided and the documents submitted, at any time during the procedure, even after the Course has started, and request the original documents to be submitted. In the case of false statements, the Institution may decide, at any time, to exclude candidates from attending the Course, based on a motivated decision issued by the Chancellor, without prejudice to the resulting criminal liability.

Art. 8. Tuition fees

The Course tuition fee amounts to € 200,00 (two hundred euros) and includes the attendance of all the lessons and the teaching material.

For those who have already attended the training course organized by the Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna in the framework of the Jean Monnet Module MARS (the intensive training course "International protection and rights of minors in the European Union" and the summer school "Family life and rights of migrant children in the European Union"), and who are willing to continue their training on migrant children rights, the fee amounts to € 150,00.

In any case, an early bird discount is reserved for candidates applying before the **31**st **May 2022**. For early birds, the course fee is € **150,00**.

Moreover, there is an **exemption** from enrolment fees for n. 7 foreign students who are international protection holders (refugees and subsidiary protection holders), in consideration of the Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna's adhesion to the **UNHCR Manifesto of Inclusive University**. The exemption will be granted on the basis of the chronological order of registration.

Pursuant to art. 9, paragraph 2 of Legislative Decree No. 68/2012 the Institution grants total exemption regarding payment of the enrolment fee in the case of students with a disability acknowledged to be equal to or greater than sixty-six percent, in accordance with art. 3, paragraph 1 of Law No. 104/1992, and applies a 1.5% reduction for every percentage point of disability in the case of students who have been acknowledged a disability of less than sixty-six percent. A student that intends to take advantage of the exemption or the reduction is required to attach an appropriate certificate to the online application.

Art. 9. Acceptance procedure and method of payment

Successful candidates who wish to attend the Course are required to confirm their attendance by the deadline indicated in the notification of admission, where will also be indicated the payment methods of the registration fee, that can be made by bank transfer or PagoPa procedure.

Art.10. Educational Qualification issued

At the end of the Course the Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies will issue a certificate of attendance, with value to the extent permitted by law, to the students who attended at least 70% of the entire training programme, and passed the final assessment test and are up-to-date with the payment of the enrolment fee.

Art. 11. Person responsible for the competitive entrance examination procedure, personal data processing and prevention of corruption measures
